Mercy Primary is an inclusive school. Collectively we encourage a warm and welcoming atmosphere, which we extend to our pupils, parents, extended family members, and all visitors to our school.

Mercy Primary promotes high levels of academic achievement. All pupils are given many opportunities and challenges to meet their full potential and are valued for their individual talents and abilities.



We follow the Alive-O and Grow in Love Diocesan Religious Education Programmes to prepare our pupils for the journey of faith and education.

We work with the Parish of Holy Cross, and parents, to prepare our pupils for the sacraments of Reconciliation, the Eucharist and Confirmation.







THE PRIMARY **CURRICULUM**

All pupils have full access to the Northern Ireland Curriculum which is primarily concerned with removing the early experience of failure and the promotion of children's self-esteem by concentrating on activities and learning experiences which encourage confidence, curiosity and creativity. It encourages children to take responsibility for their own learning.

The Primary Curriculum is set out in Six Areas of Learning:

- Mathematics and Numeracy
- The Arts
- The World Around Us
- **Personal Development and Mutual Understanding**
- Physical Education

Teachers plan together each week and agree on clear learning intentions which are shared with the pupils. Work is carefully reviewed and evaluated half termly. Assessment procedures, formal and informal, are used to evaluate the teaching and learning process.



FOUNDATION STAGE

Our Foundation Stage provides a rich, nurturing and exciting educational environment underpinned by playbased learning. The children develop their personal, social and emotional skills. They grow in confidence and their self-esteem flourishes as they concentrate on activities and learning experiences which encourage curiosity, independence and creativity.

KEY STAGE 1&2

Our KS1 children continue to build their skills through a range of formal and activity-based learning. Through our dynamic and rich curriculum our KS2 pupils become equipped with life skills enabling them to transition to post primary with ease and independence.

OUTDOOR LEARNING

At Mercy we make full use of our outstanding natural environment. Through our Forest and Eco Schools programmes we frequently take our learning outdoors exploring our extensive grounds and outdoor classroom.

INVESTING IN OUR CHILDREN

Our school believes in fulfilling every child's potential through a multi-sensory approach. We have heavily invested in online platforms such as Reading Eggs, Edshed, Times Table Table Rockstars all with an aim to reinforce learning and develop independence.

We champion the use of Accelerated Reading, this empowers children's lifelong reading habits. This extends beyond the classroom as we have strong links with our local Library and host a parent/staff book collection.

All staff are trained in teaching the Maths Mastery approach. This is an extensive and worldwide programme dedicated to the development of children's maths skills. Here at Mercy Primary, we believe that all children can succeed at Numeracy.

NEWCOMER CHILDREN

We welcome and celebrate children of all faiths and cultures, in doing so we strengthen our own beliefs and enrich our education and knowledge of the world.

SHARED EDUCATION

Assessment of children's work is an integral part of our school curriculum and is used to:

- 1. Establish each child's level of achievement
- 2. Assist the teacher to plan and meet the needs of each child

Assessment at the Foundation Stage

Assessment in Primary 1 and Primary 2 is mainly observation based. Adult observations are carried out with the children in an unobtrusive way and inform future planning. Children are made aware of their progress by receiving positive feedback and work together with their teacher to suggest ways to improve. Teachers assess pupils' cross curricular skills, thinking skills and personal capabilities, levels of concentration and involvement and emotional development.

Formal Assessment

As with all schools in Northern Ireland, Mercy Primary follows the End of Key Stage Assessment Procedures for P4 and P7, as legislated by the Department of Education and the Curriculum Education and Assessment Council. In addition We carry out GL Progress Tests in English and Mathematics in term 3 of each year P3 to P7.

Assessments are used within the primary school for diagnostic purposes and to inform future planning.









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In Mercy Primary we are proud of the excellent behaviour of our pupils and frequently visitors to our school comment on the respectful and kind learning behaviours.

The purpose of our Behaviour Policy is to promote a positive attitude towards behaviour in which the whole school community can develop a safe, secure and caring environment. We believe that children flourish best when their personal, social, spiritual and emotional needs are met through interaction with caring adults who show them respect and value their individual

Positive behaviour is promoted in each class, through relationships and connection with each

We have 3 magic rules that apply everywhere in school:

Be safe, ready and respectful.

- We try to acknowledge on-going classroom behaviour and efforts on a daily basis in small personal ways. A smile, well done or comment from staff. We continue to promote recognition, reinforcement and
- We celebrate Pupil of the Week Certificates at assembly.
- Parental support is essential to enable children to do their best in school.

Sanctions

There will be times when children have to follow boundaries and consequences. We will help teach them that inappropriate behaviour may also carry a consequence and discuss ways of making better choices in future.

Anti-Bullying Policy

Our Anti-Bullying Policy follows legislation Addressing Bullying in Schools Act NI (2016). We work hard to ensure that every child can be free and safe from bullying. We celebrate Anti-Bullying week each year and teach Personal Development Mutual Understanding and Promoting Positive Thinking Skills through Barnardos Paths Programme.



One of the great strengths in Mercy Primary is the level of pastoral care provided here by all members of staff. We see our school as a family, and work with children and parents to promote good relationships and care.

Staff

Our staff are easily identified by our school colours and we are available in the morning to meet and greet our girls as they come to school. Our pupils receive the same care at the end of the day when they are handed over to family or travel on the bus with our supervisors. Our staff communicate regularly with families and value the relationships created

We use a CPOMS system to record and respond to any concerns or needs that arise. This level of communication ensures pastoral supports are quickly identified and implemented in a caring and nurturing way.

Nurturing school

We have a whole school Nurturing Approach. We encourage children to develop an awareness of their own unique talents and abilities and to strive to reach their full potential, while respecting the uniqueness of every individual.

We help children to think positively about themselves and we create opportunities for children to contribute to school life and the life of the wider community.

Children are encouraged to develop a positive attitude to learning in a calm and inclusive school environment. We promote effective relationships between school and home and value collaboration with parents, guardians and family members.

Counselling

We provide a confidential counselling service, facilitated by an external professional organisation, which is available to pupils, on the request of a parent.

Art Therapy & Lego Therapy

We provide opportunities for children to participate in Art therapy and Lego therapy.

Safeguarding

Mrs Loughran, Principal, Mrs Owens, Designated Teacher for Child Safeguarding and Mrs Millar, Deputy Teacher for Child Safeguarding, are always available to speak to children and parents if they have concerns.





ADDITIONAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

Our school family values individual differences. All children are supported, throughout their time in Mercy. As a school, we promote a caring and supportive learning environment, where we help all girls to develop and reach their full potential

We encourage pupils to be resilient, happy and self-confident individuals, who develop social skills, communication skills and assertiveness, alongside academic achievement.

It is estimated that I in 5 pupils need extra support at some time in their school lives. In Mercy Primary we work in partnership with parents. We monitor pupil progress closely and develop suitable programmes and support to meet pupil needs.

At times we may need to provide additional support for children this might take the form of sensory breaks, small group support or additional specialist teaching.

The Special Needs Coordinators, work closely with class teachers, parents and external educational professionals' access, plan and provide support.

As an inclusive school, we have disabled access externally and internally, with a lift to access the first floor of our school.





EXTRA CURRICULAR

ACTIVITIES

EXTENDED SCHOOLS

We provide an extensive array of experiences for our children. We offer breakfast Club every morning and a whole range of afterschools clubs: Sports including Gymnastics, Multi-Sports, Mini-Games (P1).

Creativity is developed in Art Club, iPad Club, Homework Club, Stay and Play, Library Story Time Club, Lego Club. We are always improving and developing our range of extended school clubs.

SUSTRANS

We are proud to be part of the Sustrans Programme. This provides our children with extensive knowledge of road safety, bike safety and how to keep safe while outdoors. We celebrate theme days like Ditch the Dark, Ditch the stabilizers and Walk to School Week.

GARDENING

Making the most of our beautiful grounds at Mercy we have incorporated Gardening into our curriculum. The children love getting involved in maintaining and caring for our school garden. They love to cook their produce in our cookery club kitchen.

BUDDY UP

Buddy up is a cross-community programme with Edenbrooke Primary School which develops friendship, understanding and instills mutual respect with and to our friends at Edenbrooke. Teachers and pupils work collaboratively to create fun and exciting activities.

MUSIC

We are very proud of our music curriculum and being able to showcase our talents. Our girls are given the opportunity to take part in instrumental lessons and play brass and string instruments. Children can become part of our school choir and on occasions throughout the year take part in assemblies, concerts and festivals such as The Peace Proms.

OUTSIDE AGENCIES

We have a range of outside agencies who work with us or visit our school to deliver bespoke programmes, Action Mental Health, CRIS, NSPCC, Sports Coaches, Music tutors and Business in Schools to name a few.









Educational Visits

Mercy Primary provides educational visits throughout all year groups to allow pupils to develop social and interpersonal skills in a range of different environments. Visits are planned to link with cross-curricular themes in each year group and so to extend the pupils understanding of their classwork in real life situations. We have a Year 7 residential trip each year which builds up teamwork and relationships.

Parental support

We have strong, established home-school links. We use Class-DoJo and a text messaging service to enable two-way communication with parents and staff. We have monthly newsletters and a vibrant school website to keep up to date with school events.

Parents are kept up to date on their child's progress with an annual parent interviews, curriculum meetings and an end of year reports.

Parents are also welcome to attend many events throughout the year including, class assemblies and parent activities.

We also have a dedicated Parent's Room in which we host a variety of parent workshops and parent and child events. We encourage parent volunteers who are involved in fundraising and organising school events.

Happy and contented children

Ensuring a happy, healthy environment in which our children enjoy learning is central to our ethos. We have invested a lot into ensure the happiness of our children. Children can avail of sensory walks, use our in class sensory boxes or have a session in our state of the art Cubbie. We teach mindfulness strategies in Schools to our pupils to improve concentration and focus.

Healthy eating

We promote healthy eating, through healthy breaks and promoting healthy lunch boxes and children are encouraged to drink water throughout the day. A choice of healthy meals are cooked on the school premises and are served in the dining hall, while packed lunches are eaten in adjoining lunch room.

We have a strict nut free policy, in order to support children who may have an allergy.

Daily Mile

Whenever possible our pupils partake in the daily mile, this not only boosts their physical fitness it gives the pupils a chance to talk about their feelings, enjoy the fresh air and finish their mile with a general sense of well-being.


